From Pastor Tia

Greetings Friends;

On Wednesday February 14<sup>th</sup>, yes Valentines Day, Lent will begin with Ash Wednesday. Just for fun Easter this year is Sunday April 1<sup>st</sup>, yes April fool's day. These minor holidays are always fun to celebrate but much more important and pivotal to our faith is the Easter and Lenten seasons.

We begin Lent with Ash Wednesday Worship. We will gather at 7:00pm sing hymns, listen to scripture and most of all have an opportunity to have ashes placed on our foreheads in a shape of the cross where I will remind you to "repent and believe in the Gospel." A simple act that reminds us that these next forty days are sacred. Lent is a time for us to re-focus and prepare to be the people God has called us to be. It's a time when some of us may give something up, a sacrifice to offer to God. Some of us might do something more as a way to serve the One who has called us. We all have different ways of participating in Lent disciplines, but it is important that you do participate.

Our faith is an active faith. There are certainly times when we may be in prayerful meditation and biblical study, but these too require us to actively seek out quiet times. The forty days of Lent will pass whether we participate or not. God continues to call us no matter what, are we willing to answer the call, or will we just let voicemail pick it up?

Two opportunities that will be offered at the church are the Lenten Bible Study and "Rise Against Hunger" service project. The Bible study is Tuesday evenings at 7:00pm and repeated on Thursday mornings at

10:30am. This year's study is "John, The Gospel of Light and Life." You may pick up a study book and syllabus in the Fellowship Hall. The study begins the week of February 20<sup>th</sup>.

"Rise Against Hunger" is a one-day event where we will make over 10,000 meals for people in developing nations. This will be our 3<sup>rd</sup> year working with this wonderful organization. If you have come before you know what to expect and I hope you will sign up. If you have not participated before you will find it a wonderful morning of service, it is also fun. There is more information about this event in this issue of the Beacon. We will "Rise Against Hunger" on Saturday March 24<sup>th</sup> from 10:00am to noon.

Valentine's Day is fun, April Fool's day can be a hoot, but Lent can make a whole lot of difference in our lives. And Easter ... Easter is the promised fulfilled, it is the true meaning of the word Love.

**Lay Leader**

Our January Habitat build day was just this last Thursday. We had a mighty team of three: Mike Strawn, Dan Carnegie and Greg Fellers. We were joined that day by a group of 20 from a company that manufactures plastic products. Even their boss was there. It just shows how varied the support and participation is for Habitat for Humanity. This was a more physically challenging day as we spent all morning installing insulation in the walls and all afternoon installing drywall in the upstairs bedrooms. But with many helping hands, once more, it felt like a lot of progress was made in one day.

The other recent event that happened just this past Sunday, was the concert performed by Anjanette and Shin to benefit the survivors of the fires and mudslides in Ventura and Santa Barbara fires. The musical gifts displayed by these two fine artists re-confirms how fortunate our congregation is to have them as our Music Team leaders. The concert was nicely attended and, from the warm and enthusiastic applause, the guests were well motivated to give generously. We owe a big thank you to Anjanette and Shin for all their time and effort in planning and preparing a beautiful musical experience.

I have served on the Cal Pac Conference Disaster Response Task Force for 4 years, and this is the first time that we have had a major disaster in our own Annual Conference. Earlier this year, we had decided to send a team to help the flood survivors in Texas. Then, after the catastrophic fires in Northern California, we thought we would respond to the need there. Now, we have the opportunity to serve

close at home as both the South District, with the Lilac fire, and the North District, with the Thomas fire and mudslide, are working with UMCOR to secure grants to set up Long Term Recovery Groups. Well over 1000 homes were lost and another 1000 damaged, so there is much to rebuild over the next few years.

We will see how things develop this spring, but it will take several months before the LTRG's are staffed and up and running to host rebuild teams. Obviously, logistics for our team will be much simpler and less expensive, so we should be able to respond fairly quickly. We might also be able to set up a mission work team opportunity that involves folks coming for the day, as well as those that want to stay on site for the week. Stay tuned and please let me know if you are interested in being a part of a rebuild team.

Looking forward to the closer events on the calendar, our next Habitat build day will be Thursday, February 15<sup>th</sup>. The other Habitat event I would like to call your attention to is Saturday, March 3<sup>rd</sup>. Our Greater Long Beach Area Faith Coalition is sponsoring a build day with the hopes that our various congregations can join together on a special day of fellowship and service. I'm hoping that, since it's on a Saturday, we can get a new group of people to come out who get excluded on our weekday builds.

Please check your calendars and let me know if you are interested in any of these upcoming opportunities to serve and make a transformative difference in a family's life.

**Habitat for Humanity Build**

This month we're highlighting the Chavez family who are receiving a home from Habitat LA.

For the last 13 years, the Chavez family has lived in the building where Eugenia works as the onsite property manager. She works around the clock responding to concerns and often has to call the police to report trespassers and drug use on the property. Fidel and Eugenia want to become homeowners so they can provide a safe place for their children to play and not be interrupted by tenant complaints. Eugenia says, "Becoming a homeowner means the world to me and my family. It means going places together without interruption. It means stress free living. It means giving 100% devotion to my husband and kids."

Along with Eugenia's property manager job, Fidel has been working at AT&T as a Field Asset Administrator for the last 20 years. They are involved with their daughters' school and volunteer when they have the chance. Their three daughters, Kasandra, Rubi and Jazman are all enrolled in a bilingual education program. The girls are also actively involved in sports and school activities including reading club, peer mediation and art.

Eugenia says, "My experience with Habitat has been excellent! I would like to thank Habitat LA for the opportunity that has been given to me and my family to continue to grow and to teach my children to never settle, but to fight for what you believe in."



**Administrative Conference Minutes - January 13, 2018**

**Treasurer's Report:** Renate Carnegie reviewed the Bank Account Analysis and Financial Status reports through, December 31, 2017. Our income YTD totaled \$210,799 and expenses YTD \$211,317 for a difference of \$-518. Renate added that the General Fund did not take the final draw for 2017. It was noted that 2017 was a good financial year. Greg Fellers moved and Dan Butler seconded to zero out the 2017 budget. The \$2,684.78 will be transferred from the Endowment Fund. The motion passed with one abstention.

**2018 Budget Discussion:** Pastor Tia provided the 2018 budget work sheets. Projected income was based on 2018 pledge cards returned plus those that are dependable, recurring givers. It was proposed that we draw 4% of the 12/31/2017 balance of the 3 investments fund accounts for general funds. Estimates for the other income categories were made based on 2017 actuals. Total projected income for 2018 is \$234,177. All of the expense line items were reviewed. Staff Parish recommended a 5% increase for the rest of the staff; it passed unanimously with 2 abstentions. The rest of the line items were updated based on 2017 actuals. A decision was made to increase mission outreach to \$10,000 based on the number of outreach ministry proposals already planned for the year. Also, the advertising line item was increased anticipating additional expenses for a social media consultant. Total projected expenses amounted to \$233,310. It was also discussed and agreed that the first quarter of withdraws from the 3 investment accounts be made at this time. Added to the \$2,685 agreed upon above, a total of \$15,000 has been approved to withdraw.

**Endowment and Investments:** Pastor Tia shared the latest change in account value:  
 Memorials & Bequests: increased from \$174,341.79 to \$175,824.54.  
 Jubilee Fund: increased from \$891,617.67 to \$899,794.96.  
 FUMC Endowment: increased from \$108,073.87 to \$109,251.55.

**MINISTRY TEAM REPORTS**

**Worship:** Charlotta Butler announced that Anjanette Navarro and Shin Adachi will be performing a concert on Sunday, January 21 at 3:00 pm to raise funds for the survivors of the North County District fires and mudslide.

**Missions:** Carolyn Nicks reminded us that February 4<sup>th</sup> is Souper Bowl Sunday. Soup will be served at Fellowship time. Funds will be collected for replenishing Interval House toys. She advised us to save March 24<sup>th</sup> for our 3<sup>rd</sup> Rise Against Hunger event. You can register on line at <http://events.stophungernow.org/sealbeachumc2018>. This quarter's Change for Change will also be devoted to this project.

**UMW:** Kathy Fellers asked us to note on our calendars May 5<sup>th</sup>, the date for the 2018 Mothers and Others Tea. UMW sent out "Thinking of You cards" to our collage-age youth. They were well received so UMW plans to send greetings for Valentines Day and Easter.

**Trustees:** Mike Strawn reported that they are working on these upstairs projects: installing a push-bar door, better lighting in the nursery and installing a gate. Pastor Tia shared that Nick Morgan will be remodeling the upstairs bathroom as his Eagle Scout Project.

**LAY LEADER REPORT:** Greg Fellers shared a thank you letter from Habitat for Humanity for the \$940 the church contributed from our alternative giving drive. We also contributed \$1350 to Heifer Project and \$100 to the Long Beach Rescue Mission. Our monthly Habitat build day is this coming Thursday. We will have a team of 3 going. Greg attended the Cal-Pac Disaster Response Task Force meeting and there was much discussion and planning on the Conference's response to help those in the North (Thomas Fire) and South (Lilac Fire) Districts. UMCOR staff will be in both Ventura and San Diego Counties this coming weekend to discuss the formation of Long Term Recovery Groups in both locations. We will follow the developments closely as the church will plan to send at least one rebuild team this year.

**PASTOR'S REPORT:** Pastor Tia encouraged us to attend the West District Training Conference at Holman UMC on February 3<sup>rd</sup>. She distributed the book and workbook entitled **Get Their Name**; the books concentrate on the theme of radical hospitality. Our Lenten study will start February 20<sup>th</sup> with Adam Hamilton's **John – The Gospel of Light and Life**. Pastor will be on vacation January 30<sup>th</sup> – February 7<sup>th</sup>.




