From Pastor Tia

Greetings Friends,

Lent this year begins on Ash Wednesday, February 14th. At First Church we will begin Lent with our Ash Wednesday Service at 7:00pm. Yes, I know it is Valentines Day, but we will still gather for a service that reminds us to keep a holy Lent and have a sign of the cross placed on our foreheads with ashes. This service will also be shown live on Facebook.

For our Lenten Study this year we will be using the book *Wrestling with Doubt, Finding Faith*, by Rev. Adam Hamilton. "Everyone has doubts. Where is God when bad things happen? Does God hear our prayers? Is there a heaven? How can we know? Often, we treat such questions as the enemy of faith. But uncertainty doesn't mean our belief is lacking. Doubt can be a path to a deeper, richer encounter with God.

In Wrestling with Doubt, Finding Faith, we will explore some of our most significant sources of doubt and shows how a steady trust in God can emerge from them. We will delve into questions like: "Does God exist? How can I know?" "Is the Bible true?" "Why do prayers go unanswered?"

Rev. Hamilton approaches these sources of doubt with honesty and insight, drawing on the rich wisdom of the Bible, Christian tradition, and his experience walking with thousands of people on their spiritual journey. Whether you're a longtime Christian or someone brand new to faith, this book will lead

you to a trust in God that is unafraid of hard questions. Wrestle with doubt and find faith—belief and trust, not certainty; mystery rather than simple answers." (Cokesbury)

Each Sunday we will explore provocative questions about our faith and on Wednesday's, beginning on Feb. 21 7:00pm we will meet on Zoom to discuss each chapter of the book. Below are the subjects we will cover: 2/21 -ls there a God? 2/28 - The Good Book? Wrestling with the Bible. 3/6 – Are All Non-Christians Going to Hell? 3/13 – Is Heaven Real? 3/20 – When Prayers Go Unanswered. 3/27 – Why Do the Innocent Suffer? I encourage you to purchase the book for the weekly study, or to use it as a resource for the Sermon Series.

You will find on page 4 of this Beacon a list of your Lay Leadership and a summary of the 2024 Budget. In all ways the Leadership of First Church aims to use the resources given us to further the mission and ministry of Jesus Christ. Administrative Council Minutes — January 20, 2024

Present: Pastor Tia Wildermuth, Johnny Scott, Carolyn Nicks, Barbara Arnold, Beth Barinek, Dan and Charlotta Butler, Greg and Kathy Fellers.

Greg Fellers opened our in-person meeting at 9:10 am in the Fellowship Hall. Barbara Arnold led us in prayer.

Minutes: Carolyn Nicks moved that the December 9, 2023 minutes be approved as published. Dan Butler 2nd the motion and it passed unanimously.

Treasurer's Report: Johnny Scott reported our Bank Account Analysis as of December 31, 2023: Checking = \$20,263.84. Interfaith-payroll direct deposits = \$3.090.52. He noted that we have \$16,697.49 in Available Operating Funds. Please see page 6 for the Treasurers Report. It was noted that we have paid 85.46% of our Apportionments, during the pandemic years and until 2024, the Conference allowed 85% of Apportionments as being fully paid. We have been paying 100% but after discussion we voted unanimously in December to pay 85% for 2023.

Pastor Tia reviewed the totals as of January 20, 2024

2024 Budget Workshop:

Our Budget Workshop involved discussion and discernment of all income and expense line items projected for 2024 resulting in a General Budget of \$296,780. The budget was balanced through the necessary utilization of investment funds of \$141,706. Barbara Arnold moved to adopt the 2024 Budget as proposed. Dan Butler 2nd the motion and it passed with a unanimous vote.

MINISTRY TEAM REPORTS:

Trustees: As the new Trustee's representative. Dan Butler reminded us of the transition they have started: the legally responsible representative (Dan) and other members will be divided up into property zones as of now: Sanctuary - Dan Butler, Parsonage -Lynn Adkins, Fellowship Hall upstairs -Richard Irving, Fellowship Hall downstairs - Garry Chapman, Offices & restrooms- Harlene Goodrich Church Gardens-Greg Fellers. Concerns, etc. can go straight to the appropriate Trustee. That person will evaluate the need and make a recommendation to the Administrative Council. Decisions about hiring vendors, etc. will be made by the Administrative Council. We are moving toward a "One Board Governance." This should help to streamline decisions and make opportunities move efficiently. For further reference to leadership the Lay Leadership for 2024 see Page 4.

Greg reported that the \$1,881 rebate check arrived from the OC Municipal Water District. The remaining negative

balance shown in restricted funds will .91% he zeroed out.

> The need for a new computer in the Finance Office was discussed. Dan Butler moved that we use Memorial funds for a computer recommended by our Treasurer, Johnny Scott, and contingent on knowing the price. The final price being approved by the Ad Council via email. The motion was 2nd by Carolyn Nicks and passed unanimously.

Worship: Charlotta Butler noted that the worship colors have changed to green for the Sunday's after Epiphany season. The new worship music schedule gives the choir more time to practice: the Trio and Bells perform once a month and the Chancel choir twice a month.

Missions: Carolyn Nicks reminded us that Super Bowl is February 11th and our Fellowship time is Souper Bowl. She has folks making soups and someone baking homemade bread for the occasion.

SPPRC: Beth Barinek – No Report

UWF: Kathy Fellers shared the accomplishments of their December meeting. They elected their 2024 officers. There is still a vacancy for a recording secretary, Jeanne Mignacca is presently filling that position. If anyone is interested in the secretary position, please contact Kathy Fellers. The group voted to keep their yearly West District pledge at \$1,000 paid quarterly. The Serenity Soap vendor from the Boutique donated 2 boxes of lovely hand-made soaps. We donated them to the Long Beach




