#### Abbreviated Administrative Council Minutes — March 9, 2024

<u>Present:</u> Pastor Tia Wildermuth, Johnny Scott, Carolyn Nicks, Beth Barinek, Dan and Charlotta Butler, Joyce Strawn, Greg and Kathy Fellers.

Greg Fellers opened our hybrid meeting at 9:08 am. Charlotta Butler led us in prayer.

<u>Minutes:</u> Kathy Fellers moved that the February 10, 2024 approved as published. Carolyn Nicks seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

Treasurer's Report: Johnny Scott reported our Bank Account Analysis as of February 29, 2024: YTD Checking = \$13,162.28, Interfaith = \$5,077.46. He noted our Financial Status: Actual YTD Income as \$49,858. Actual YTD Expenses at \$44.128 are under budget by \$5,340. Pledged & Non-pledged giving YTD total \$30,590.80. Budgeted YTD total \$24,852.00.

# Endowment and Investment Committee:

Pastor Tia reviewed the totals from March 8<sup>th</sup>

- Jubilee Investments: \$659,901
   2.4% up YTD (withdrew \$15, 000 last month)
- 2. Memorial & Bequests: \$134,618 2.2% up YTD
- 3. Endowments: \$89,525 2.33% up YTD

Total investment: \$884,044 2.37% up YTD

#### **MINISTRY TEAM REPORTS:**

<u>Trustees:</u> Dan Butler, Trustee President, started his repair list with the Serenity Room leaking near the win-

dows. Pastor Tia suggested that the awnings also be sealed. The Serenity Room carpet also needs to be replaced due to the leaking. A contractor from GM Roofing evaluated the leaking roof above the stage area. The insurance adjustor cannot give an estimate until April at the earliest. Harlene Goodrich is working on purchasing a rug for the Narthex. Greg Curd is available to help with any remediation concerns, from the flooding. Pastor Tia will be contacting New Systems for a Termite check of the Parsonage.

Charlotta will be polishing the cross, Beth & family will decorate with butterflies, Fellers and others will bring palm fronds, also bring the food and signage to the beach. Pastor Tia will be asking others for help.

On Sunday March 24th he filmed a post-worship group singing the birthday song along with holding a banner. UWF had a sheet cake in her honor and a few folks took her slices of cake, flowers & the video on Monday March 25th, her birthday. Charlotta Butler and Kathy Fellers attended the 2024 District Leadership Training zoom to get useful ideas for meeting programs.

We started planning for our Mothers & Others Tea and are aiming to hold the event on May 11<sup>th</sup> from 1:00-3:00 pm. We choose "We Care of Los Alamitos" as our mission to fund from the Tea proceeds.

During our recent rains the Fellowship Hall, the upstairs storage room and the wall next to the lower stair-

way suffered water damage in three locations.

In the Serenity Room, where the 12step groups meet, the sealing around the windows failed. There was significant damage to the wall board below the windows. We have a bid from a contractor to remove and replace the sealing around those windows and the window at the top of the stairs.

The other locations are in the southwest corner of the building. Evidence of the damage can be seen as blistered paint on the wall above the stage in the Fellowship Hall. The upstairs storage room & the wall along the lower stairway also are damaged. The location of the leak is still under investigation. Once it is determined, a plan of action will be formulated.

In all of these cases, we are consulting with our insurance carrier.

WE CARE of Los Alamitos is a family support center sponsored by local churches, community groups, corporations and concerned citizens. They serve families residing in the areas of Northwest Orange County including the cities of Los Alamitos, Seal Beach, Rossmoor, Huntington Beach, Fountain Valley, Cypress and Stanton.

They provide the under privileged and the poorest members of society with the financial support they need to prevent them from losing their home. Their fight to help prevent homelessness requires a clear vision of what they are trying to achieve, the specific

strategies they must implement to achieve this vision, and a system for measuring their progress. They are a busy and productive mission in need of our support.


"The Life You've Always Wanted:
