| Special Administrative Council Meeting Minutes — April 3, 2024 | | | | |

| Present: Pastor Tia Wildermuth, Carolyn Nicks, Dan and Charlotta Butler, Joyce Strawn, Barbara Arnold, Lynn Adkins, Richard Irving, Harlene Goodrich, Greg and Kathy Fellers. Greg Fellers opened our virtual meet- ing with a prayer at 5:08 pm. All items on the Agenda are repair issues: Dan Butler, Trustee president, started the repair list with the leaking of water around the windows in the Serenity Room and the hallway at the top of the stairs. The proposal from Broadway Glass & Mirror to repair the leaks in 3 windows is \$1,480. That comes with NO guarantee or Warrantee. The major concern is with the caulking. The recommendation is to have it removed and replaced. Dan researched the recommendation and the \$1,480 estimate and found them reasonable. Dan moved that we go ahead with the project and pay the first half (\$740). Carolyn Nicks 2 nd the motion and it passed by a hand vote. The expense will come from the Jubi- lee Fund. | answer could be found for the water damage to the southwest corner of the building. The latter idea was approved by a consensus. The termite issues at the parsonage were inspected by Jesus of New Sys- tems Exterminators. He felt that the termites were only in the parsonage garage and recommended spraying for \$945. Lynn moved to approve the rec- ommendation and the motion passed. Jesus noted the termite issues in the church supply room, the fellowship hall and the storage room above the office may be due to moisture; the affected areas would be treated by drilling small holes then sprayed. Other areas of ter- mite concern are the sanctuary subfloor area which will need to be sprayed for subterranean termites. The quote for the total service is \$2,840. With more widespread termite issues than in previ- ous years, Greg asked Jesus for an estimate for tenting and was given a number of \$6000-\$8000. After much discussion on how much to do now, Barbara Arnold moved that we start by taking care of the termite issues with just spraying. Dan 2 nd the motion and it passed. | the stage getting wet as well. Again, the apparent damage extends 4'-5' on the south wall and 8'-10' on the west wall. Since the ceiling tiles contain asbestos, Coastline is recommending that Burns Environmental Services be engaged to do the work in the storage room. Water damage to drywall was also found next to the exterior office door at the bottom of the stairs. This apparently coming from the leaking window at the top of the stairs. We are awaiting the written report from Coastline as well as a work proposal for removal of all water damaged materials as well as remediation for possible molo issues. The handling of asbestos mate- rials will be done by Burns and we are awaiting a proposal from them also. It was decided that further decisions would be handled by email at the time the work proposals are submitted. The proposal would be shared and dis- cussed and voted on via email. Our insurance company was also noti- fied and has been out to inspect the water damage both on the interior as well as the roof and exterior. We are awaiting their report also. | | |
| Next issue is the possible leaking roof. The area was reviewed by Darrel Stoskopf and GM Roofing and found to be basically sound. GM Roofing did recommend some work to extend the roofing life in one cor- ner where it pools for \$2,350. There was considerable discussion on whether to do the stopgap mainte- nance or go ahead and do the entire roof (possible total for \$20,000). The other option was to hold off on any decision on the roof until a definitive | Another moisture issue: Water leaking and damage to the Southwest corner of the Fellowship Hall (near the stage), as well as the same area in the large stor- age room above. Pastor Tia called out Coastline Services for an inspection and recommendation. The acoustic ceiling tiles in the corner got wet as well as the drywall from ceiling to floor mostly on the west side of the corner out about 8'-10'.
