Sunday Morning Worship - Our Advent sermon series is "Experincing Christmas – Christ In the Sights and Sounds of Advent."

Sunday Dec. 1 – Is The First Sunday of Advent when we light the candle of Hope. The sermon title is "Do You See What I See?" As the Advent season begins, we will celebrate Holy Communion.

Tuesday Dec. 24 – Christmas Eve Worship 7:00pm – At this special service we will do a modern take on the reading of the lessons and singing carols. The Scriptures and Hymns will be familiar but will be presented in a different way. The homily will be "Do You Know What I Know?" We will also celebrate Holy Communion and end our service with the lighting of candles and singing of "Silent Night."

Sunday Dec. 29 – On this First Sunday of Christmastide the theme of the worship will be "Do You Sing What I Sing?" One this Sunday I will read a lovely Christmas story and we will have a hymn sing where you will decide what Christmas hymn we will sing.

Administrative Council November 9, 2024 by Kathy Fellers						
Present: Pastor Tia Wildermuth, Johnny Scott, Carolyn Nicks, Beth Barinek, Barbara Arnold, Dan and Charlotta Butler, Greg and Kathy Fellers. Greg Fellers opened our hybrid meet- ing at 9:02 am. Carolyn Nicks led us in prayer. Minutes: Dan Butler moved that the minutes of_September 14, 2024 be approved as published. Barbara Arnold seconded the motion, and it passed unanimously. Treasurer's Report: Johnny Scott reported our Bank Account Analysis as of October 31, 2024: YTD Check- ing = \$14,762.07, Interfaith-payroll direct deposits = \$5,098.79. He noted that we have \$8,207.07 in Available Operating Funds. Financial Status Report: Actual YTD Income as \$283,806 with Budgeted Income as \$247,610 with a difference of \$63,196. Actual YTD Expenses at \$277,688 are over budget by \$30,348. Pledged & Non-pledged giving YTD Balance = \$138,539.26. Budgeted YTD total = \$124,260.00. Johnny addressed the over budget expenses by referring to Account #5.30.140 Facility Maintenance & Re- pairs where the Insurance refund of \$20,000 partially offset the expenses. Johnny has been looking into web- sites to meet our need for a better computer in the financial office. How- ever, due to the prospect of a newly donated computer, we may have that concern solved. A concern was noted that only 32.80% of our apportion- ments have been paid to date.	It was decided to make a payment now and review our apportionment obliga- tion options at our December meeting when Pastor Tia will give us a detailed list of what makes up the total of our apportionments. Endowment and Investment Com- mittee: Pastor Tia reviewed the totals as of November 7, 2024. 1. Endowments: \$96,481 down .10% for quarter, up 10.28% YTD 2. Memorial & Bequests: \$139,706 down .24% for quarter, up 10.01% YTD 3. Jubilee Investments: \$596,401 down .22% for quarter up 10.53% YTD Total investment: \$832,588 down .21% for quarter, up 10.42% YTD We are fortunate that our investments held quite strong even though we need- ed substantial repairs from water dam- age. MINISTRY TEAM REPORT: Trustees: Dan Butler noted that what was termed "useful items" were placed back into the newly painted storage room on October 8 <sup>th</sup> . Shelf and floor space is available now. The concern over the safety and compliance codes for our deteriorating outside ramp were solved by the work of Darrell, Russ and Greg. The new ramp is "glide-on-easy, sturdy and weatherized.	GM Roofing's Torch down roofing (see detailed description in Secretary's book). was completed. And there is no gravel near the pipe in the corner. Greg checked out the work and observed a job well done. Follow up needed: Pastor Tia noted the safety issue of needing a spotlight & camera at the door by the mailbox. She and Darrel will research the subject. New parking lot striping was done in one day by the Strawn's, the Rosen's and Richard Irving.
