From Pastor Tia

Greetings Friends,

Happy New Year! Honestly, because of the busy schedule here at the church I am writing this article with Christmas just a week away. So, to say Happy New Year seems a bit premature.

Although the reality is it's just two weeks away. I'd love to say that gives me plenty of time to plan a strategy to implement my New Years resolution. But I can't say anything close to that.

My new year's resolutions don't resemble anything that are resolute. Honestly, I should call them new year's I might get around to it by summer. Not sure if that is true for any of you, but I imagine I'm not the only one who feels that way.

So, this year I am going to try something different, and you are invited to join the journey. The sermon series for January and February is entitled "New Beginnings – Lessons from the Early Church." The scripture focus will be from the Book of Acts.

Of course we will begin the year with Epiphany Sunday: the day we celebrate the arrival of the Magi to the baby Jesus. The second Sunday in January is traditionally "Baptism of the Lord." This Sunday will be the beginning of our dive into Acts. I can't think of a better way to celebrate "New Beginnings" than by recommitting ourselves to Jesus with the Renewal of Baptism.

The book of Acts is a continuation of the Gospel of Luke. It picks up after the Resurrection and right before the Ascension. As Jesus ascends, he promises to be with us always and calls us to make disciples of all nations. And so, the Christian Church begins on that first day of Pentecost as the Holy Spirit inspires the Apostles to preach the "Good News." We learn about Peter as the leader of the Church and how Paul was called to preach the "Good News" to the gentiles. We learn about the new beginnings of this new church, this new group of people called to be a community. We learn about the growing pains that always happen with new beginnings. We learn how some traditions need to be left behind and new traditions celebrated.

I'm hoping the two months before Lent will give us a time to not only learn about the early church but also give us some time to reflect on our walk with Jesus. Perhaps challenging us to start fresh in our discipleship. The journey that Jesus calls us to can be difficult but is always fulfilling.

Whether you make resolutions or are more like me, we all can start a new year with a new beginning in our faith journey. I hope you will join me for this challenge.

Endowments:

Present: Pastor Tia Wildermuth, Johnny Scott, Barbara Arnold, Joyce Strawn, Dan & Charlotta Butler, Greg & Kathy Fellers.

Greg Fellers opened our hybrid meeting at 9:06am. Charlotta Butler led us in prayer.

Minutes: Charlotta Butler moved that the minutes of Nov. 9, 2024 be approved as published. Dan Butler seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

Treasurer's Report: Johnny Scott reported our Bank Account Analysis as of Nov. 30, 2024; YTD Checking = \$23,644.96, Interfaith-payroll direct deposits = \$5,070.51. He noted that we have \$17,337.53 in Available Operating Funds. Financial Status Report: Actual YTD Income as \$322,316 with Budgeted Income as \$272,371 with a difference of \$49,945. Actual YTD Expenses at \$305,437 are over budget by \$33,363. Pledged & Non-pledged giving YTD Balance = \$156,119 Budgeted YTD total = \$136,686.

A concern was brought up about apportionments since it was noted that only 56.32% has been paid. We reviewed our apportionment obligations and decided we will pay 100% of non-conference obligations and 75% of the Conference apportionment at this time. Pastor will email us an accounting of our obligations this week, and we will decide on whether we pay 100% by January 10th.

Endowment and Investment Committee:

Pastor Tia reviewed the totals as of Dec. 12, 2024.

 Memorial & Bequests: \$131.000 up .82% for quarter up 11.19% YTD

3. Jubilee Investments: \$602,944 up .22% for quarter up 11.63% YTD

> Total Investment: \$821,235 up .87% for quarter up 11.63% YTD

We are fortunate that our investments are doing so well.

We discussed celebrating our church's 110th birthday. We proposed a Legacy giving event for July of 2025.

MINISTRY TEAM REPORT: Trustees:

Greg Fellers reported on the deterioration of the roof over the exterior stairwell. A group consisting of Pastor Tia, Greg Curd, Darrel Stoskopf & Greg Fellers met with Tim O'Keefe to discuss possible options for repair. Those options are:

- 1) Remove the existing roof and rebuild a new one \$27.450.
- 2) Remove the existing roof and build a new roof over the landing only \$22,150.
- Remove the existing roof \$19,975
 All the existing posts would also be replaced.

After discussion, it was decided to go for option 3 but with the addition of awnings similar to the ones on the 10th street side. It was also discussed that there might be a possibility of not replacing all the posts. The possibility of getting a competitive bid was discussed and it was decided to give Tim the bid.

Construction will take 12-15 days. Starting date not known at this time.

Worship: Charlotta Butler complemented Anjanette Navarro on the worship's musical presentations. The addition of micing the section leaders and congregation has enhanced the worship even more. The Beach Bells are especially enjoying presenting their skills. We value our social media and Christian has done well trying to balance microphone and camera work for our worship streaming.

Missions: Pastor Tia reminded us that the lunch program is going well and she thanked our food donors. Sue Dunbar's Girl Scout troop food collection has been helpful. Carolyn can always use more helpers to make peanut butter sandwiches and pack lunches.

SPPRC: Pastor Tia complimented John Rogers on his playing as he substitutes for Eric Anderson.

<u>UWF:</u> Kathy Fellers reported that UWF met on Mon. Nov. 9th for a short meeting to finalize the disbursement of funds that they raised during the year. They voted to send \$220 to each of the 10 causes that they had researched throughout the summer and fall. Wanting to have some funds in the treasury for emergency needs such as weather-caused disasters they lowered their UWF pledge to the District. The end-of-year agenda accomplished, they adjourned to a delicious luncheon from Polly's Pies Pick Up.

Lay Leader: Barbara Arnold has received even more positive comments on the music program: especially having the choir move out of their loft and face the congregation and the energy of the Beach Bells presentations. She reminded us of the Invitation Cards that we can carry in case we meet someone we would like to introduce to our church.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Tia summarized our Pledge Drive which seems to have a similar income as last year. Our Social Media contract with Nicole Reilley will end Dec. 31st. We agreed that her Social Media program is money well-spent and unanimously voted to renew the 1st installment (6 months) of her contract for 2025. Pastor Tia shared her ideas for January and February 2025 starting with Epiphany Sunday followed by a Sermon Series entitled the Acts of the Apostles. She suggested that we continue to think of ideas for a 110th birthday celebration. She also reminded us that CalPac is providing a series of Webinar Labs that Council members are encouraged to attend.

<u>Unfinished Business:</u> Concerning the safety issue of needing a spotlight & camera at the door by the mailbox, Pastor Tia found an economical Ring Camera for the "front door" (near the mailbox). Darrel will do the installing. It was discussed that there needs to be new lighting over the door at the top of the stairs when the old roof is removed.

New Business: Greg brought forward the idea of the need for a new Church Directory. Pastor Tia will ask Jeanne to put a notice in the Beacon for folks to update their information then Jeanne can better update the Directory.


